Treasurer's trivia,

Hello everyone,

It was only a few weeks ago that we were looking forward to our branch events being held over the next few months and in particular our branch rally. The Corona virus has put paid to all that. Our branch meetings are now suspended and our rally postponed. We are hoping that it might be possible to hold our rally later this year but as with our branch meetings it is impossible to plan anything at present. The committee will keep everything under review and once we feel able to plan again then we will let you all know.

Our February branch meeting was a great success with a superb talk given by Max Hunt on Herbert Austin. It was not an easy journey to our meeting from Upton for Bob and myself. We had both left home early and hit a quite horrendous hail storm; I almost had to stop driving. Incredibly, on arrival at Kempsey it was bone dry! I was not sure how many members would be coming; I knew some could not make it for health reasons and, very understandably, some members were becoming concerned about the virus. Despite this some 21 members assembled in the skittle alley to hear Max's talk. His talk covered not only the life of Herbert Austin but also encompassed the BMC years from 1952 right through the Leyland years until Rover cars finally ceased production. In conjunction with a fine selection of slides Max started by recalling how Austin had been born in Buckinghamshire in 1866 before emigrating in 1884 to spend some time in Australia. He principally worked for the Wolseley sheep shearing company there and it was for this company that he returned to England in 1893. He constructed his first car in 1893; a 3 wheeler in which he drove to Rhyl and back. It was in 1905 that he formed the Austin Motor Company and purchased an old print works at Longbridge to start manufacture. Max showed us slides how the early Austin cars were noted for being large, very solidly built cars which in many respects were over engineered. However, that did change in 1922 with the introduction of the Austin 7 one of the most famous cars ever made. Like many manufacturers, the Longbridge works turned over to war work during both the first and second World Wars. Everything from aeroplanes to ammunition was produced and in incredible quantities. Herbert Austin had also tried his hand at aeroplane building between the wars bringing out a light aircraft with fold away wings that could go in a garage known as the Austin Whippet. Max showed us how he had built a village at Longbridge for his employees using pre-fabricated bungalows from Australia many of which are still occupied. Herbert Austin himself died at his home, Lickey Grange, in 1941 but Max continued the story through the following decades. There were many names from the past such as Leonard Lord, Donald Stokes and Michael Edwards. A most fascinating story and evening and we thank Max for visiting us.
