


Construction Clinic

The needle valve in the float chamber was failing to shut off at times or sticking shut at other times resulting in fuel starvation. It is easy to think that it is the needle valve itself. However, on examination I found quite a bit of contamination on the copper float resulting in it not operating freely on the central spindle. A very thorough clean of the float has resulted in no further problem.
