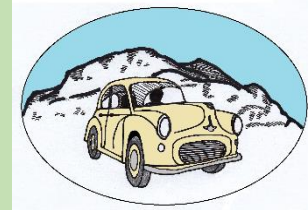




## Malvern Hills Branch Newsletter September 2017
